TUITION

Whatever tuition schedule you qualify for, once you hit 15 credits per semester, the tuition rate freezes (in other words, you can take 18 credits—or 21—for the same rate you pay for 15 credits. This is a little-known feature, and students who can handle the extra load should take advantage of it!



DECLARE A MAJOR OR MINOR

To declare a major or minor, go to the Center for Academic Advising and Student Support homepage. Click on the navigation bar “Declare Major / Minor” and scroll down to fill in your information.

Earning a single major, a double major, or a minor is not difficult.



How To Earn a Double Major In French

Students who are completing a different major in a different department can double major in Foreign Languages (with an option in French). Double major students are required to complete 30 credits in French (of which 24 must be in courses numbered 300 or above).

How To Earn a Single Major In French

Students who are only pursuing a major in Foreign Languages (with an option in French) are considered single major students. Single major students are required to complete 30 credits in French (of which 24 must be in courses numbered 300 or above). In addition, single major students also have a linguistics requirement and a second language requirement.

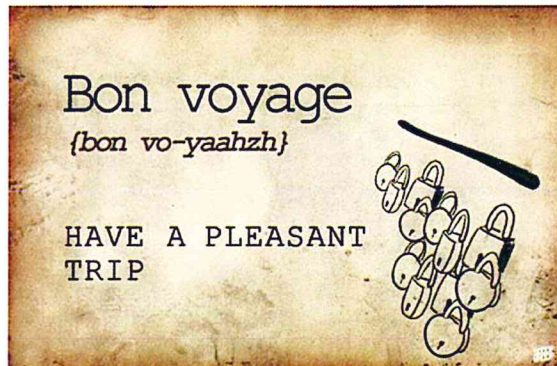

How To Earn a Minor In French

How to obtain a Minor in French

Students can add a minor in French to their current major(s). Students who wish to minor in French are required to complete at least 18 FREN credits (a maximum of 6 FREN credits are allowed in the 200 level, meaning that at least 12 credits will be at the 300 level).



FLiP to France (Faculty-led international program).

The two-week FLiP course to Paris for May 2022 has been approved (see next page). The course includes a MS2 short course (Mondays from 4 to 5). You can begin registering for it at the Education Abroad page:

Applying is done online.

The trip is done in even-numbered years (i.e. 2022, 2024, 2026, 2028, 30....).

International Studies Minor

The International Studies Minor is now housed in Languages and Linguistics. The advisor for the program is Dr. Fetzer (gwfetzer@nmsu.edu). The minor allows for a broad range of inquiry into disparate fields of study, including geography, communications, philosophy, international business, political science and agriculture. Open to all undergraduates, this course of study adds dimension to your major and reflects our increasingly interconnected world.

International Studies consists of 18 credit hours of approved interdisciplinary course work of which at least 12 are upper division (300 level or above). No more than 3 credits of Independent Study may be applied to the minor and only 2 courses (6 credits) may be double counted with the course of the student's major(s). Students must maintain a minimum 2.5 GPA.

The curriculum consists of 6 categories of courses. Students take one from each: Introductory Course; International Experience; Culture / Arts / Humanities; History, Geography; Government / Politics / Economics; and Health / Education / Environment.

French Culture & Civilization Paris, France

Faculty Led International Program

On the French Culture and Civilization program, students will take French courses Monday-Friday for 3 hours a day at the ACCORD Language School in the morning and spend the afternoon exploring Paris. The program includes a guided bus tour of Paris on arrival day, a full day excursion to Versailles, entrance to multiple museums including the Louvre, Musée d'Orsay, Musée du quai Branly, and much more.
